To what extent have the outcomes of this result area been achieved?					
<p>Successes: gender based violence (GBV) is treated as a multidimensional problem, therefore multi-sector (i.e. medical, psycho-social and legal support) solutions are offered; UNFPA works closely with other implementing partners; UNFPA works closely with community leaders, including sheikhs, religious leaders, local governing councils and education/health workers, youth activist and IDP groups. Challenges by seeking legal support are, that judges and police officers are changed regularly, so this fact requires additional orientation and coordination by (INGOs); GBV underreported due to the shame and stigma; escalation of the armed conflict and political instability in the country remains one of the major challenges for the implementation of the project.</p>

Reasons for result achieved.			Compared to planning the results are achieved. In fact, more GBV survivors were reached with specialized GBV services than planned. The planned establishment of functioning networks is targeted for 2019. The report states clearly how efforts were made to establish those networks. It was not expected that the networks would be established and functioning already between October 2017 and September 2018. However, there are some delays in the establishment due to challenges described below.		
Implications for planning.			The challenges remain as the conflict in Yemen is ongoing. The start up of new activities in Yemen is usually delayed because of bureaucratic processes and the lack of coordination and functioning governmental entities. The difficult circumstances need to be respected while looking into opportunities to assist IOs and INGOs with the start of new activities. In reality this means almost all Yemen projects need no-cost extensions at the end of the activity date.

To what extent have the outcomes of this result area been achieved?					
<p>The voucher system enables women to access the necessary motherhood services by submitting a voucher. The vouchers have a unique barcode that is then scanned in the hospital and reimbursed by MSY. Successes: The vouchers system for motherhood services has proven to work well in Yemen; Yamaan works closely with the Ministry of Public Health and Population (MHP) despite the challenges linked to the current war; Yamaan works with different local organisations and associations and with international organizations like USAID, ADRA and GIZ; Yamaan conducts quality assessments for all health facilities in their network and improving the Health Facilities on a long term Challenges: bureaucratic delays; escalation of the armed conflict and political instability in the country remains one of the major challenges for the implementation of the project.</p>

However, there is a 50% increase in productivity with the new voucher system allowing claims to be finalized in the required period. Other than that, Yamaan is running on schedule.

Main Challenges are: currency fluctuations, increasing prices, shortages of medical supplies and challenges in importation of contraceptive commodities, challenges finding qualified doctors in some governorates, movement and travel restrictions, electricity and telecommunications outages, and opposition to MSY services. These challenges affect MSY's day-to-day operations and require regular risk assessment and mitigation.
