To what extent have the outcomes for this result area been achieved?		Interventions from the Social Fund for Development (SFD) are accepted and welcomed by the communities. the result achieved ensures that a increasing number of people have access to clean drinking water and sanitary facilities. SFD is contracting the beneficiaries using cash for work scheme to implement the interventions, this approach reduced the workload and guaranteed ownership. Due to the quick implementation, SFD achieved the results before the end date of the activities. SFD kept close coordination with the embassy of the Netherlands on the challenges in the field (e.g. switched from target community due to a recent outbreak of social conflict) revised plans and project lists were discussed frequently and approved.

Assess achieved results compared to planning:		B. Results achieved as planned		
Reasons for result achieved.		Related to 'number of river basin organizations supported on watermanagement': UNICEF originally planned to rehabilitate 13 rural water supply systems in the Sana'a water basin; 9 rural water supply systems were rehabilitated. The project was significantly impacted by the security situation in Sana'a. Scarcity of fuel in the city made transport of supplies and equipment expensive and hiring qualified labor forces became more difficult. UNICEF could only accommodate nine systems under the current situation.		
Implications for planning.		Activity ended in 2017.		
Which lessons can be learned for this result area?		Successes: the commitment from community leaders to UNICEF interventions secured by written commitments; combining two approaches, 1. addressing the WASH needs of the conflict-torn people of Yemen 2. providing durable solutions through strengthening communities. Challenges: the escalation of violence, political divisions, financial crises which prevented salary payments for over one year and affected the delivery of critical government services and the sudden cholera outbreak. The ongoing security situation in Sana'a has significantly impacted the price of construction materials and services in the past years.
